Our annual NSHS Plant Sale & Auction is coming up on Thursday, May 25th. This year, Jo Goodwin-Rogers will be our auctioneer and share her expertise with us as a rich variety of horticultural gems go up for bid.

Everyone is encouraged to share some of their wonderful plants, bulbs, ground covers, bushes, flowering trees and other items known to entice gardening enthusiasts. And garden-related items such as garden tools, planters, plant art, pots, garden furniture and garden whimsy are also welcome. Another date to remember is May 20th. This is the date by when you should dig and pot your plants in order for them to have time to acclimate to pot life.

The sale of pre-priced items starts at 6:00 PM, and the auction starts at 6:30 PM. Cash and checks are the only forms of payment that we can accept. This event is the major fundraiser for NSHS.

Ahead of time:

Let friends and neighbors know and plan to bring them to the event! A flyer is provided along with this newsletter mailing.

Preparing plants for the Sale/Auction:

Dig and pot plants by May 20th.

Label plants with: common name, scientific name (if known), light requirements (sun/shade), soil requirements (moisture), flower color and bloom time, height, deer/rabbit resistance.

Dropping off plants and other items:

Bring your labeled plants and other items to the Sacred Heart Hall at 62 School Street *during these hours only*:

Thursday, May 25th 2:00 - 5:00 PM

Enter the parking lot and look for help from one of our volunteers. Note: The earlier that you drop off your items (during these hours), the more time there is for us to organize them.

Remember to bring these items to the Sale/Auction:

If you plan to pay by check, bring two checks: one for the Sale and the other for the Auction.

Cardboard boxes, **plant trays**, and **newspaper** to make it easier to transport your purchases home. (NSHS will provide compostable bags).
